



What is the MoCC?

The first of its kind in the world, the Jockey Club Museum of Climate Change (MoCC) offers an interactive and multimedia exhibition showcasing valuable collections and information about climate change. It is an ideal venue for the public, especially students and teachers, to champion the cause of environmental stewardship and keep themselves abreast of the latest developments on environmental conservation and sustainability. Extended activities of the MoCC exhibition include an eco-tour that guides visitors around the prime ecological sites and green facilities on the vast CUHK campus, and a variety of workshops and activities that promote green living. The MoCC is a supporting unit of the Sustainable Development Solutions Network Hong Kong, advocating the Sustainable Development Goals in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development of the United Nations.

MoCC AMBASSADORSHIP 2018/19 —2ND RECRUITMENT

GENERAL INFORMATION

What is MoCC Ambassadorship?

The MoCC Ambassadorship recognizes and provides financial support for outstanding CUHK students who wish to become active ambassadors to the MoCC to raise climate change awareness and promote sustainability on and beyond campus. MoCC Ambassadors undergo knowledge training in climate change, sustainability and museum operations.

Each MoCC Ambassador is required to intern in the MoCC to pursue, under supervision, experiential learning that carries educational benefits for the Ambassador and are relevant to the MoCC's operational and outreach activities. The amount of internship time shall not be less than 40 hours within the full six-month term of the Ambassadorship (or pro rata if the term is less than six months).

The amount of financial support of the MoCC Ambassadorship within the six-month term is provided on a scaled basis, at **HK\$55 per hour** for the first 50 hours of experiential learning engagement, **HK\$60 per hour** for the second 50 hours and **HK\$65 per hour** beyond, to encourage and recognize long-term contributions to the MoCC and the community. The sums are payable on a monthly basis and only after the student completed the knowledge training. When the students graduate from the Ambassadorship, each of them will be awarded a certificate of completion, as well as entitled to a permanent complementary membership of the CUHK-JC MoCC Alumni Association to enjoy numerous benefits.

Who may apply for the Ambassadorship?

Applications are open to all undergraduate and postgraduate students of CUHK. Students in related fields (major or minor), such as sustainable development, earth system science, museum studies, geography, environmental technologies, environmental science or those who have a track record in participating in environmental services, may be given priority.

How to apply?

Interested students are requested to complete the [online application form](#) by 11:59 pm, **25 January 2019 (Friday)**.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited by phone to attend a selection interview to be held either on 31 January or 1 February 2019. Successful applicants will be contacted by phone and email shortly afterwards.

What is the required commitment in terms of time?

The ambassadorship is tenable for six months between March and August 2019 (the Term), successful applicants (the MoCC Ambassadors) will be required to undertake the knowledge training (compulsory) in February and March, and the experiential learning engagement (the internship) thereafter. The ambassadorship may be renewed for another year upon demonstration of excellent performance and the availability of funding.

Each MoCC Ambassador will be required to intern in the museum and pursue at least 40 hours of experiential learning engagement during the Term, but should not exceed 18 hours per week. Duty rosters of the internship shall be subject to agreement among the ambassadors at the monthly meetings, but priority shall be given to those who have not attained the 40-hour requirement. On occasions where the ambassadors are unable to attend the monthly meetings, they shall inform the coordinator well in advance.

What are the expectations?

The MoCC Ambassadors are required to:

- **Knowledge training:** attend all sessions of knowledge training (see 'What are the important dates?' below) which include sessions of mock and pilot museum- and eco-tours
- **Experiential learning:** intern in the MoCC by serving in shifts to guide visitors on MoCC tours and to answer museum-related questions from the visitors
- Be encouraging and welcoming to visitors
- Assist in conducting impact studies pertaining to MoCC exhibitions and eco-tours
- Be able to guide the campus eco-tours
- Discuss and, if necessary, update the contents of the eco-tours
- Assist in organizing MoCC events such as workshops, seminars and campaigns
- Be peer mentors of Team MoCC members (secondary school students)
- Represent the MoCC on occasions of museum and university events and ceremonies
- Participate in monthly meetings (see 'What are the important dates?' below)
- Be punctual in all meetings and duty assignments (no absence without prior notice is allowed)
